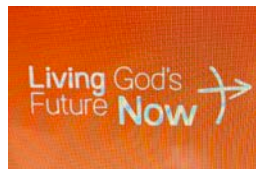
NEWS

IDEAS FOR THE FUTURE

The **Heartedge network** is an ecumenical network whose purpose is to offer support and encouragement to help churches and other groups or individuals develop and flourish. It is focused on 4 areas of concern and activity: Congregation, Compassion, Culture and Commerce. It offers a new way of being church. Have a look at their website: www.heartedge.org. Pastoral visiting - as we emerge from the restrictions of the pandemic, it will become possible once again to visit people in their homes. If you (or someone you know) might welcome a visit, please contact the Benefice Office. If you would be interested in forming part of a pastoral ministry team, please contact the Rector - it is vital that this be a shared ministry across our church communities; it is simply not possible for the Rector to do all the visiting across the four parishes himself. If there is enough interest, we could look to training people to share in this key aspect of ministry.



Refresher Course - the basics of Christianity. Would you be interested in a course that examines the basic building blocks of the Christian faith in a small discussion group? Many of us never received any structured teaching at the time of our baptism or confirmation; some of us might be a bit rusty; some of us might have some unanswered questions or areas of doubt. If people are interested, we could explore all this together in an open and supportive discussion group. Contact the Benefice Office if you would like to know more.

Living in Love and Faith - the Church of England is engaged in a programme of listening and learning about issues of gender, sexuality, identity and relationship. These are topics which affect us at the deepest level of our humanity and in relation to which the Church has experienced and is experiencing still great division and great pain. Living in Love and Faith is a national process of listening to the views of others in an attempt to understand better experiences and viewpoints on these matters that may differ from our own, including the way in which we understand Scripture to inform and guide us in this regard. It would be very good if we could be part of this process of learning and listening in some way in our Benefice - there are often voices and viewpoints that are not heard, and this is an attempt to enable all voices to be heard.
